ACTIVITY LEVEL **ACTIVE**

Moderate pace; good mobility needed; stairs and prolonged standing for more than 2 hours at a time; some longer days involving early mornings and/or late evenings; some walking on varied terrain. This Activity Level is not recommended for travelers with mobility issues such as someone who uses a cane, walker, or wheelchair.

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Embark on a scenic and cultural journey through Maine and Eastern Canada, beginning with a visit to the Center for Maine Craft and a self-guided tour of the Museum at Portland Head Lighthouse. Cross into Canada with the guidance of a “kilted” local tour guide as you explore Saint John, Fundy National Park, and the Hopewell Rocks, then travel by ferry to Cavendish, the beloved home of Anne of Green Gables. Discover the natural beauty of Cape Breton, known as the “Scotland of America,” with the Cabot Trail, Cape Breton Highlands National Park, and a visit to the Bell Museum celebrating Alexander Graham Bell’s life and work. Complete your adventure with stops in Halifax, Peggy’s Cove, and along the Evangeline Trail at the French Acadian site of Grand Pre, experiencing stunning landscapes, historic sites, and charming coastal communities.

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DAY 1 – TRAVEL TO PORTLAND, ME

After departing from Buffalo, Rochester, or Syracuse, your adventure begins as you arrive in South Portland, Maine, and check in to the DoubleTree Hotel, ideally located near shops, restaurants, and just five miles from Portland's Old Port district. Enjoy a warm welcome with the hotel's famous cookies and a reception before gathering for dinner. A Maine Tour Lobsterette will meet you with information for your upcoming border crossing, setting the stage for the journey ahead.

DAY 2 – INTO NEW BRUNSWICK

After a hearty breakfast, begin your journey north with a stop at The Center for Maine Craft, showcasing unique handcrafted work from Maine artists. Continue through Bangor and enjoy lunch on your own at Dysart's before heading to Calais and crossing into Canada. Arrive in Saint John, New Brunswick, where you'll settle in at the Hilton and meet your lively kilted local guide who will accompany you through day 7.

DAY 3 – SAINT JOHN TO PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

Following breakfast, today begins with a guided tour of Saint John, known for its Loyalist roots and the natural wonder of the Reversing Falls. Travel through scenic Fundy National Park to marvel at the towering Hopewell Rocks, then cross the impressive Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island. In Cavendish, visit the beloved Green Gables House before enjoying a traditional lobster dinner and checking in to your hotel in Charlottetown.

DAY 4 – PEI TO NOVA SCOTIA

After breakfast, depart PEI by ferry and journey to Nova Scotia's Cape Breton region, fondly known as the "Scotland of America." Stop in Baddeck to explore the Alexander Graham Bell Museum, where the inventor's legacy comes to life. Arrive at your tranquil accommodations at the Silver Dart Lodge for a relaxing two-night stay amid Cape Breton's scenic beauty.

DAY 5 – THE CABOT TRAIL

Prepare for a breathtaking day, after breakfast, as you travel the famed Cabot Trail, a stunning 186-mile loop through Cape Breton Highlands National Park. With panoramic coastal views, dramatic cliffs, and lush highlands, this route offers some of the most spectacular scenery in North America. A boxed lunch keeps you fueled for the day's adventures, and dinner awaits upon your return to the lodge.

DAY 6 – TO HALIFAX

Following breakfast, leave Cape Breton behind and journey to Halifax, Nova Scotia's vibrant capital. An afternoon city tour highlights Halifax's rich maritime history, from the Halifax Explosion and Titanic recovery efforts to landmarks like Citadel Hill, St. Paul's Church, and the bustling waterfront. Your overnight stay is at the centrally located Hampton Inn Halifax.

DAY 7 – PEGGY'S COVE AND RETURN TO NEW BRUNSWICK

After breakfast, travel to Peggy's Cove, a charming fishing village perched on granite cliffs, and one of Canada's most photographed spots. Follow the Evangeline Trail to Grand Pre to explore the poignant story of the Acadian expulsion, then head through the lush Annapolis Valley to board the ferry from Digby back to Saint John, New Brunswick. Dinner on board is suggested before returning to the Hilton Saint John for your final night in Canada.

DAY 8 – BACK TO MAINE

Say farewell to your kilted guide after breakfast and cross the border back into Maine, adjusting your watches as you return to U.S. time. Stop again at Dysart's for lunch on your own before continuing to Portland. Your afternoon includes a visit to the historic Portland Head Lighthouse and Fort Williams for stunning ocean views and a touch of maritime history. Cap off the day with a farewell dinner and your final overnight at the DoubleTree Hotel in South Portland.

DAY 9 – DEPARTURE

After breakfast, begin your journey home, reflecting on the memories made and scenic beauty experienced throughout your Maritime adventure.
