ITINERARY:

Day 1 – Your journey begins with transportation from Buffalo, Rochester, or Syracuse provided by D&F Travel to Alexandria, Virginia. Upon arrival, savor a delicious dinner at the historic Fish Market Restaurant, where Chesapeake-style seafood is served in a renovated 200-year-old warehouse in the heart of Old Town. Afterward, check into the Hampton Inn & Suites Fort Belvoir Alexandria South, where baggage handling is included, and settle in for a relaxing evening. (D)

Day 2 – Following breakfast, meet your local guide in Old Town Alexandria for a fascinating walking tour that brings Revolutionary War and Civil War history to life. Continue with a dockside and onboard tour of the Tall Ship Providence, where you'll step into the shoes of an 18th-century sailor, explore the captain's cabin, and even learn how to load a cannon before viewing a short film at the Naval History Theater. Lunch and shopping on your own, with the afternoon including a visit to Christ Church and the Georgian-style Gadsby's Tavern Museum. The evening features a special included dinner at Gadsby's Tavern itself, where George Washington and other Founding Fathers once dined—complete with a visit from Martha Washington herself! (B, D)

Day 3 – After breakfast, spend the morning at Mount Vernon, the beloved estate of George Washington. Tour the Mansion, view original furnishings, and visit the Ford Orientation Center & Donald W. Reynolds Museum before taking part in a moving Wreath Laying Ceremony at Washington's Tomb. After lunch on your own, explore Washington's reconstructed Distillery and Grist Mill, where whiskey and cornmeal were once produced, and then head to the National Museum of the United States Army for exhibits on the Army's founding and Revolutionary War history. Conclude the day with a hearty included dinner at Bertucci's Italian Restaurant before returning to your hotel. (B, D)

Day 4 – This morning, following breakfast, experience a guided visit to the National Archives, where the original Declaration of Independence, U.S. Constitution, and Bill of Rights are on display. Next, enjoy a guided tour of the U.S. Capitol, followed by a stop at Florida House, the only state embassy in Washington, D.C., for refreshments and a glimpse of Florida history. After lunch on your own at the Capitol Café, continue to the National Portrait Gallery, home to the only complete collection of presidential portraits outside the White House. Tonight, dine at The Point D.C., an award-winning waterfront restaurant, before embarking on an illuminated driving



tour of Washington's monuments and memorials, including stops at the Kennedy Center and the WWII Memorial. (B, D)

Day 5 – Following breakfast, begin your day with a guided visit to Constitution Gardens on the National Mall before touring the elegant Larz Anderson House, headquarters of the Society of the Cincinnati and a National Historic Landmark. The afternoon is spent at the National Museum of American History, where exhibits include the Star-Spangled Banner, the First Ladies' inaugural gowns, and treasures of American innovation, with time for lunch on your own at the museum café. In the evening, enjoy a savory farewell dinner of authentic barbecue at Texas Jack's in Arlington before returning to your hotel for the night. (B, D)

Day 6 – After breakfast and hotel checkout, enjoy your final morning exploring the Smithsonian museums of your choice. Options include the popular National Museum of African American History and Culture, the Air & Space Museum, the Natural History Museum, or the National Gallery of Art, among others. Enjoy lunch on your own at one of the many museum cafés before rejoining your fellow travelers for the return trip home, bringing with you a deeper appreciation of Alexandria and Washington's rich history.
