## ITINERARY

### DAY 1 – OCTOBER 4, 2026

Depart from Buffalo, Rochester, or Syracuse and begin your journey to the charming town of Stockbridge, Massachusetts. Your first stop is the Norman Rockwell Museum, where you can enjoy lunch on your own in the scenic terrace café before taking a guided tour of Rockwell's studio. Learn about the beloved American illustrator's life and work in the very space he once called his "best studio yet." Later, travel to Providence, Rhode Island, where you'll enjoy an included dinner before checking in for an overnight stay at the Courtyard Providence Warwick. (D)

### DAY 2 – OCTOBER 5, 2026

After an included breakfast at the hotel, depart for a guided tour of Providence, Rhode Island also known as "America's Renaissance City." Explore highlights like Burnside Park, the Old State House, Prospect Terrace Park, and Brown University, where you'll stop for a brief visit. Then head to southeastern Massachusetts for a cranberry bog experience, where you'll get up close to a flooded cranberry bog and learn about antique harvesting equipment. Continue to Sandwich, the oldest town on Cape Cod, where you'll enjoy lunch on your own and free time in the village. Afterwards, visit the Sandwich Glass Museum to watch a live glass-blowing demonstration and explore its history. In the evening, check-in at Blue Water Resort in South Yarmouth for two nights, where dinner at the hotel is included, followed by a relaxing free evening. (B, D)

### DAY 3 – OCTOBER 6, 2026

Begin your day with breakfast at the hotel before heading to Hyannis to board a ferry to Martha's Vineyard. Upon arrival, enjoy a guided "Down Island" tour, taking in the scenic charm of local villages. In Oak Bluffs, experience a walking tour of "Cottage City," featuring stops at the Flying Horses Carousel, Gingerbread Cottages, The Tabernacle, and more. Then, explore Edgartown during your free time, where you can enjoy lunch on your own in this historic whaling town. After returning by ferry, wrap up the day with an included dinner and return to hotel for the evening. (B, D)

### DAY 4 – OCTOBER 7, 2026

After breakfast depart for a day rich in Cape Cod history and gardens. Begin with a step-on guided tour of Hyannisport, with a photo stop at the Kennedy and Korean War Memorials overlooking Veterans Beach. Visit the John F. Kennedy Hyannis Museum, which features a multimedia exhibit chronicling JFK's time on Cape Cod. Enjoy lunch on your own in downtown Hyannis before going to the Heritage Museums & Gardens in Sandwich. On a guided tour, explore rotating exhibitions, stunning botanical gardens, antique cars, a historic carousel, and outdoor sculptures. Later, arrive in Newport, Rhode Island, where you'll check in to the Wyndham Newport Hotel for two nights. Your evening includes dinner conveniently located at the hotel. (B, D)

### DAY 5 – OCTOBER 8, 2026

Start your day with breakfast at the hotel before embarking on a guided Colonial tour of Newport, walking through its historic neighborhoods. Then visit The Elms Mansion, a grand "summer cottage" built for coal magnate Edward Berwind in the early 1900s. After the self-guided mansion tour, enjoy free time for lunch and shopping at the Brick Marketplace, a charming open-air collection of shops and eateries. In the afternoon, take a self-guided tour of the iconic Breakers Mansion, the Vanderbilt family's luxurious summer home overlooking the ocean. The Cliff Walk, accessible from the mansion, offers a picturesque photo opportunity. Return to the hotel to freshen up before heading out for an included dinner. (B, D)

### DAY 6 – OCTOBER 9, 2026

Enjoy a final breakfast at the hotel before departing for Hartford, Connecticut. There, you'll explore the Mark Twain House & Museum on a guided tour, followed by an engaging Living History Interpreter presentation in the Carriage Barn. The visit concludes with an included catered lunch, before departing for home, filled with memories of culture, history, and coastal charm. (B, L)
