ITINERARY:

Day 1: Depart this morning from Buffalo, Rochester, or Syracuse and travel east toward the charming New England coast. Upon arrival in Portsmouth, New Hampshire, check in to the Holiday Inn Portsmouth, a full-service hotel featuring an indoor heated pool, on-site restaurant, and cozy lounge. Located just a mile from the historic waterfront district and the Maine border, it's the perfect base for your first night. This evening, enjoy a delicious, included dinner with your fellow travelers. (D)

Day 2: After breakfast at the hotel, meet your local guide for a narrated exploration of the Portsmouth Harbor Trail, where you'll discover the city's deep connection to the river and hear fascinating tales of early settlers, patriots, and ship captains. Stop to admire the trompe l'oeil ceiling at St. John's Church and take in the scenic views from Prescott Park, including the historic Portsmouth Shipyard. Continue north to Freeport Village for shopping time at L.L. Bean's flagship store and a variety of outlets and cafes for lunch on your own. Then, enjoy a scenic coastal drive to Bar Harbor, crossing the Causeway to picturesque Mt. Desert Island. Check in for a three-night stay at the Atlantic Oceanside Resort Hotel, offering pools, a Jacuzzi, and stunning views of Frenchman's Bay. Tonight, savor an included dinner at the resort. (B, D)

Day 3: Enjoy breakfast before setting out with your local guide for a full tour of Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park—the first national park east of the Mississippi. Travel the Park Loop Road to see Cadillac Mountain, Thunder Hole, Sieur de Mont Springs, and the Wild Gardens of Acadia, featuring plants from 13 distinct park habitats. Learn about the area's natural wonders and the wealthy summer residents who once built lavish "cottages" here. Break for lunch on your own and time to browse Bar Harbor's waterfront shops and scenic shoreline path. This afternoon, board a narrated nature cruise on Frenchman's Bay in search of eagles, porpoises, seals, and other wildlife, with views of Egg Rock Lighthouse and Acadia's rugged coastline. Tonight, don your souvenir Maine Lobster Hat and feast on a traditional Maine lobsterbake dinner with all the fixin's. (B, D)

Day 4: After breakfast, visit the tranquil Asticou Azalea Gardens, known for their brilliant blooms and blend of English and Japanese design elements. Then, enjoy a leisurely included lunch at the elegant Bar Harbor Club, with stunning views over Frenchman's Bay. The afternoon offers free time in Bar Harbor to revisit shops, stroll the shoreline, or simply relax before dinner on your own—either at the resort or in the heart of downtown. (B, L)



Day 5: Following breakfast, travel south to Boothbay Harbor, the sailing capital of mid-coast Maine. Learn about the area's maritime heritage as you tour the spectacular Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens, where woodland and riverbank paths meet the rocky shoreline in a tapestry of native plants. Enjoy free time in Boothbay for lunch and exploring its charming village streets lined with galleries, boutiques, and fishing wharves. In the afternoon, embark on a Lobster Trap Hauling and Seal Watch cruise on Linekin Bay to see how lobsters are caught and keep an eye out for playful seals. Later, travel to Portland and check in for two nights at the Hyatt Place Old Port, located in the lively historic district with restaurants, nightlife, and shops right outside the door. Dinner is on your own tonight to enjoy Portland's vibrant dining scene. (B)

Day 6: Begin the day with breakfast, then meet your local guide for a tour of Portland, including the famous Portland Head Lighthouse and a private guided visit to another lighthouse typically closed to the public. Walk the granite jetty, see the keeper's quarters, and enjoy sweeping views of Casco Bay. Then, head to New Gloucester's Pineland Farms for a box lunch, time to explore the gardens, and a visit to the gift shop. Continue to the Maine Wildlife Park, home to over 30 native species including moose, black bears, mountain lions, eagles, and more. This evening, gather for a memorable farewell dinner at DiMillo's on the Water, a unique floating restaurant in Portland Harbor. (B, L, D)

Day 7: After breakfast, enjoy a narrated tour of Kennebunkport with its sandy beaches, rocky coastline, and charming historic center. Pass the Bush family estate at Walker's Point, hear the story of the Wedding Cake House, and visit the serene Franciscan Monastery with its landscaped grounds, shrines, and chapel. Then, relax on the journey home with wonderful memories of your New England adventure. (B)
