ITINERARY:

Day 1 – Your adventure begins with included transportation from Syracuse, Rochester, or Buffalo to Livonia, Michigan, where you'll check into the Hyatt Place Detroit/Livonia. Upon arrival, baggage handling will be taken care of, leaving you free to settle in comfortably. In the evening, enjoy a welcome dinner at Bravo! Italian Kitchen, just a short drive from the hotel, featuring a delicious menu and warm hospitality. After dinner, return to your hotel for a restful night. (D)

Day 2 – After breakfast at the hotel, begin your day in downtown Detroit with a narrated city tour highlighting the architectural gems, business district, and landmarks like the Spirit of Detroit. Step inside the Guardian Building for a behind-the-scenes tour of this magnificent Art Deco treasure. For lunch, dine in elegance at the Whitney Mansion, a stunning 1894 estate-turned-restaurant, where you'll enjoy a glass of champagne and a guided tour of the property. The afternoon continues with a visit to the Ford Piquette Avenue Plant Museum, birthplace of the Model T, followed by a tour and tasting at Detroit's first post-Prohibition distillery, Two James Spirits. End your day with a flavorful barbecue dinner at Slows Bar-B-Q before returning to the hotel. (B, L, D)

Day 3 – Following breakfast, embark on a special guided tour celebrating the Legendary Ladies of Detroit. Hear fascinating stories of women who shaped the city's culture, from automobile design pioneers and civil rights leaders to musicians and entrepreneurs, with stops at unique local sites such as Canvas Detroit. Next, enjoy a guided visit to the Detroit Institute of Arts, home to masterpieces like Diego Rivera's Detroit Industry Frescos and Van Gogh's Self-Portrait, with time for lunch on your own at the museum café. In the afternoon, tour the historic Michigan Central Station, recently restored to its original grandeur. The evening concludes with an authentic Polish dinner at Polonia Restaurant in Hamtramck before returning to your hotel. (B, D)

Day 4 – Begin your day with breakfast before immersing yourself in American history at Greenfield Village, where historic homes, working farms, and demonstrations bring the past to life. Then, visit the Henry Ford Museum of American Innovation to explore an expansive collection of artifacts celebrating the country's technological and cultural progress, with lunch available at onsite restaurants. In the afternoon, stroll the grounds of Fair Lane, the former estate of Henry and Clara Ford, with a chance to explore the gardens and possibly the mansion itself. This evening, step aboard the Detroit Princess Riverboat for a sunset dinner cruise featuring a prime rib carving station, live Motown entertainment by The Prolifics, and spectacular views of Detroit's skyline. Day 5 – After breakfast and hotel checkout, enjoy a scenic drive through the upscale Grosse Pointe neighborhood en route to the Ford House, the elegant lakeside estate of Edsel and Eleanor Ford. Wander the mansion and gardens at your own pace, experiencing the refined charm of this historic home along Lake St. Clair. Conclude your Detroit journey with a farewell lunch at The Continental, a restaurant offering exceptional cuisine and views of the water. Afterward, board your coach for the return trip home, filled with wonderful memories of Detroit.
