ITINERAY:

Day 1: Depart from Buffalo, Rochester, or Syracuse, accompanied by a AAA Group Travel tour host who will be with you every step of the way. Arriving in Philadelphia by early afternoon, enjoy free time and lunch on your own at the bustling Reading Terminal Market, where more than 80 vendors serve everything from authentic Philly cheesesteaks and Pennsylvania Dutch specialties to global flavors from family-run stands. Next, immerse yourself in American history with a guided tour at the National Constitution Center, an engaging museum dedicated to celebrating and exploring the U.S. Constitution. This evening, enjoy a warm welcome dinner at Iron Hill Brewery & Restaurant, featuring a very special visit from none other than “Benjamin Franklin” himself! Check into the Holiday Inn Express Philadelphia – Penn’s Landing for a comfortable overnight stay. (D)

Day 2: Start the day with breakfast before meeting your guide for the “Once Upon a Nation Story Stroll” through Philadelphia’s Historic District. Along the way, hear captivating tales from costumed storytellers and visit landmarks including Independence Hall, the Liberty Bell, Carpenters’ Hall, Christ Church and its historic burial grounds (final resting place of Benjamin Franklin), and the Betsy Ross House for an audio-guided tour. Midday, enjoy lunch on your own at one of the many charming eateries in Old City. In the afternoon, explore the Museum of the American Revolution, where immersive exhibits and artifacts bring the fight for independence to life. Dinner is on your own this evening, leaving time to explore Philadelphia’s vibrant downtown dining scene. (B)

Day 3: After breakfast, journey to Valley Forge National Historical Park, where General Washington’s Continental Army endured the winter of 1777–78. See Washington’s stone headquarters, reconstructed soldier huts, and the imposing National Memorial Arch while learning about the hardships and heroism of this pivotal time. Enjoy an included lunch at a local “revolutionary” restaurant before heading back to Philadelphia for a fascinating tour of Eastern State Penitentiary, once the most famous and expensive prison in the world and now an eerie but intriguing ruin. This evening, savor an included dinner at the stylish Positano Coast before returning to the hotel. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Following breakfast, travel to Washington Crossing Historic Park, where your guided tour will share the story of George Washington’s daring 1776 crossing of the Delaware River—a turning point in the Revolutionary War. Enjoy an included buffet lunch at the historic Washington Crossing Inn before heading to Pennsbury Manor, William Penn’s recreated 17th-century estate, for a guided tour and a look at the award-winning exhibit *William Penn: Seed of a Nation*. Return to Philadelphia to freshen up, then gather for a memorable farewell dinner aboard the Moshulu, a historic tall ship permanently docked at Penn’s Landing offering fine dining with waterfront views. (B, L, D)

Day 5: After breakfast and hotel check-out, visit Fort Mifflin, site of the largest bombardment of the American Revolution. Explore its history, view surviving battle scars, and watch a uniform and weapons demonstration, with an optional cannon firing for an authentic touch of history. Depart for home with lasting memories of America’s Revolutionary heritage and the spirit of Philadelphia. (B)
